STUDY QUESTIONS
Have you ever prayed what seemed like an impossible prayer? When? What was the result?
2. Take a look at Joshua 10:12-15. What did Joshua pray?
What gave him the confidence to pray it?
Did it matter that he didn't quite know how to word his prayer?
3. Identify some prayers that God does not seem to be answering right now. What might God be wanting to do in you if he chooses not to respond as you want him to?
4. What did Pastor Harry say was the enemy of leadership?

Why is this true?
What do you think are the true marks of a great leader?
5. How did Jesus show himself to be the best kind of leader?
What were his prayers like? Find one in the New Testament. How does his prayer compare to yours?
6. If you have been praying boring prayers, what has held you back from praying with courage and risk?
7. What steps of faith can you begin taking now that will enable you to arrive at God's promise for you in the future?
<b>Personal Meditation:</b> If you are a believer, then you are in a position of leadership based on Jesus' command to his followers in Matthew 28:18-20. What kind of mojo does it take for you to take the words of this command seriously? How focused are your prayers on just you and what you think you need or deserve? This week spend some time thinking about this commission Jesus gave you and your current level of mojo to do what he has asked.
